On Wednesday I attended a STEM professional development. "What is STEM?" I hear you asking. STEM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. Over the past 10 years of National Standards the focus of most teaching and learning has been on Numeracy (Mathematics) and Literacy (Reading and Writing) and the Science and Technology curricula have been put to one side because of that focus. This professional development aims to give teachers tools and ideas on how to integrate science and technology back into the day to day teaching in classrooms and give teachers and school leaders the information and skills to explain to school communities the importance of teaching science and technology in schools. We include science and technology in our school curriculum through our Enviro Schools activities and are looking to broaden our students science and technology learning through more STEM activities. This learning develops their thinking and reasoning skills as well as their collaborative and problem solving skills which are and always have been key to becoming lifelong learners

I'm looking forward to seeing you all next Friday evening at the performance of Te Nui.
