MONEY TIME

The Year 7 and 8 students in Room 4 have been using an online financial literacy resource called Money Time. Ask your year 7 or 8 about it. Next week the year 5s and 6s will be let loose on money time too!

MoneyTime is a self directed learning experience for New Zealand. Students complete financial lessons on-line at their own pace. They test their knowledge via multi choice tests and quizzes and teachers receive immediate feedback on their results.

Complementing these lessons is a money management experience in which students get to make their own financial decisions. They earn money by answering the quiz and test questions correctly which is paid into a virtual bank account. They then have a choice of spending, saving or investing it.

The result is they have a whole lot of fun learning how money works in the safety of their classroom!

BASIC FACTS PRACTICE




