

Well, what a hot summer we have had! Welcome to autumn and a few cooler nights but still lovely weather.

Williams trucking was kept busy moving bee hives through the Christmas/new year period, out of the region and lately bringing them home to be extracted. A few weeks helping Reisima Haulage with a huge hay season plus the usual bits and pieces has made the summer roll on by!

For the month of April, we are running a promotion to highlight one of the many services offered by Williams Trucking. We will donate \$10 to your local school for every four wheeler or side by side transported to and from town for a service from your preferred service agent. We will have the local bike shops on side so you will be able to request that you have us transport your bike. So remember, book that pre-winter service for the month of April. Maybe some new tyres for the impending wet season!

Williams Trucking are a bit different to the previous owners, in that trucking is our core business and we are not afraid to take on the bigger jobs too. Our wool cartage rates are very reasonable and if you sell in the shed, the transport cost will be factored into the price you receive. By having us transport your wool, you could use this as a bargaining tool to achieve a premium for your product, whilst supporting your local trucking company. You do have a choice. Larger wool clips not a problem as we can cart around 40 bales per trip.

The same goes for your local hardware store offering free cartage. Nothing is free in 2019! Have us transport your timber/posts, then see how much \$\$\$ you can trim off your building supplies total cost.

For all your out of town freight, we have a depot in town where products can be delivered to, then transported by us to your property.

As some of you will be into autumn slowing/re-grassing by now, remember to have your fertiliser and seed reps put William's trucking down as your preferred transport service. We will get bagged fertiliser orders emailed to us from the supplier that way.


