

Phones collected help our School gain valuable rewards and the environment also benefits by keeping our landfills free of mobile phones and their array of hazardous toxic substances.






Below are the results of a survey posted in December last year which the Board of Trustees has asked to be published for the school community to review. We received 8 responses out of 22 families.

School Culture: Tinui School's vision is below. Do you think this statement reflects our school culture?





Prompt communication. Need to give a bit more notice about things occurring, so parents can be available to help. Could perhaps create an induction kit for new students eg uniform, emergency contact forms etc.

The school looks tired, we feel it has lost it's community vibe. We would love to see the school return to being the hub of the community, we seem to have become so caught up in our own busy lives that we neglect to nurture important relationships, like the relationship with our teaching staff, our neighbours, other school families and the wider community. I feel sometimes as parents we are letting our children down by not fostering the schools RESPECT values.

To date I am happy with the school and don't have any areas of improvement correct and better communication with parents.


More of an emphasis on the basic fundamentals of primary school education reading... writing.... maths I would like to see an increase in the output of curriculum content.



Think it's a great improvement. Would like to see part of the learning conference involve the students where they are able to talk to their learning.




Learning Conferences (meetings with teachers and my child) are effective in informing me about my child's general progress and achievement.






When communicating with our families we like to ensure we reach everyone. Technology is used more and... you access to the internet at home?


Is communicating via, emailed newsletters, website, and Facebook the best way for us to send information to you?






Would you prefer a 'hard copy' newsletter?


