It has been confirmed that school will not be open on Wednesday the 29th of May as Primary, Area School and Secondary school teachers who are union members are striking. Parents and caregivers will have to keep children at home or make other arrangements for their care.

We have received several nominations for our triennial Board of Trustee elections and as we have more nominations than vacancies we will be having an election. You will receive your voting papers in the mail and will have to send them via post to be counted by June 7th. All parents of students at Tinui School are eligible to vote and it is important that you do have your say in voting for the parent representatives on our Board of Trustees.

I would like to thank Luce Williams and Kylie Blyth (who are standing down) for their service to the school on our Board over the past few years.


