It has been an exciting week with the arrival of Mrs Mieke Couling to our Tinui School family. Mieke will be teaching in Room 4 as our principal release teacher and comes to us with experience teaching in both rural and town schools as well as a background in university lecturing so is a fantastic addition to our school. Mieke's son Cedric also joins us at Tinui School and is a year 5 learner in Room 4.

The rural schools cross country is next week. Thank you to those of you who have offered to be marshals on the course. We are hoping the weather will clear by Thursday. (There is no postponement date as the interschools meet is the following Wednesday.) Rural kids starts next Wednesday. Our students will be travelling to Opaki School to participate in a number of different activities (Boxing, Art, STEM, Squash, Gym, and woodcraft) and will mix and mingle with students for other rural schools.

I recently read a book called "Empower" about students taking control of their own learning. One of the chapters talked about consuming vs creating using technology and used the acronym LAUNCH. It focussed on students using design thinking and being creators, not just consumers using technology.

Look, Listen and Learn

Ask tons of questions

Understand the process or problem

Navigate ideas

Create a prototype

Highlight what works and fix what's failing

Then Launch / share to an audience.

This process is a great fit for our kids and we will be giving it a try in the future to encourage our students to be creators not just consumers using technology.
