

Kia ora koutou Tinui whānau and friends!

I am finally back in the Wairarapa after visiting 3 amazing learning campuses in Hamilton this week with a group of Masterton Principals. We visited Te ao Marama, a 0-6 school which opened this year, Discovery School which opened 4 years ago and Rototuna High Schools - two schools on one site. A years 7-10 middle school and a years 11-13 high school which is into its 3rd year. You may be wondering why as a cluster of principals we would visit schools like these. That is a good question and the answer is not to look at the buildings but to look at the way these schools are implementing teaching and learning. All of the schools are operating student centered learning programmes and are developing teaching and learning philosophies that are not based on what would be considered traditional. They are developing teaching and learning programmes that are student centered and all have a philosophy not of "one size fits all" but of "one size fits one." The students were learning through individualised learning programmes that were tailored to their needs and in most cases involved project based learning for a considerably large proportion of their learning. Yes students were being taught how to read, write and do maths but a significant chunk of their learning was integrated into other learning areas and learned through cross curricular integration eq. students were learning english through the arts or mathematical learning through art. The students on all campuses also had a significant amount of choice in when and where they completed their learning the older and more independent they were. Without exception every student I spoke to, who had experienced traditional learning at another school and had moved into one of the newer schools, preferred their new school and did not want to return to the way they used to learn. The visits to these schools has inspired me to continue to move forward with the style of learning we are developing at Tinui School that is agentic, moving toward cross curricular integration as well as more passion based projects so students are fully engaged in their learning and not just doing it because they have been directed to. This doesn't mean our kids will be doing what they want when they want. It means they will be learning through doing things that they are engaged in which is the most powerful learning!

PROJECT BASED LEARNING

What the Heck Is Project-Based Learning?

Project-based learning (PBL) is a student-centered pedagogy that involves a dynamic classroom approach in which it is believed that students acquire a deeper knowledge through active exploration of real-world challenges and problems. Students learn about a subject by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to a complex question, challenge, or problem. It is a style of active learning and inquiry-based learning. PBL contrasts with paper-based, rote memorization, or teacher-led instruction that presents established facts or portrays a smooth path to knowledge by instead posing questions, problems or scenarios.
