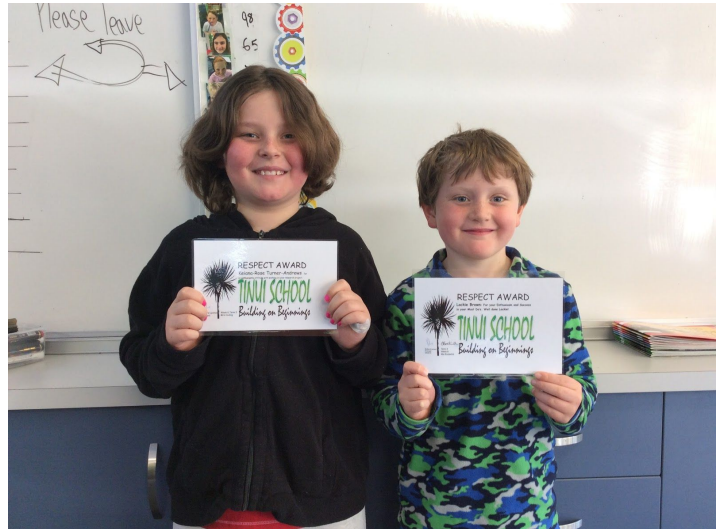

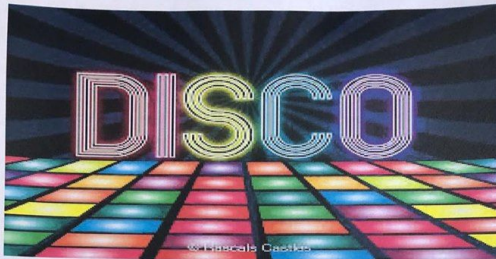
Download the Skool Loop App from the App Store or Google Play
