I also had my final of 4 performance appraisal meetings for the year with Lisa Shelton our board of trustees chairperson and my appraiser Colleen. It was a long meeting and one of the comments made by Colleen was I don't shout enough about the excellent teaching and learning pedagogy we have at Tinui School or about my personal successes or about the outstanding literacy and numeracy achievement at our school. It's not in my nature to self promote but on reflection I should probably a little more, so here goes.

In 2019:

90% of all students at Tinui School were working within or above expected levels in reading.

86% of all students were working within or above expected levels in writing.

96% of all students were working within or above expected levels in mathematics.

That is spectacular and a testament to the hard work that our teachers put into their programmes and the effort your kids put into their learning. Very few schools in New Zealand have numbers like these!

Next year I will be participating in the Springboard Trust programme for school principals. Only 6 principals are selected each year in the Wairarapa. The selection process consists of a 2 hour interview and then a written submission explaining why the candidate should be chosen. On acceptance the candidate is paired with a business mentor and the mentor works with the principal to develop a strategic plan for the school based on community, board and student input. The mentor could be from any number of large companies based in the Wellington region. Check out their [website](#) if you would like to know more. 
